

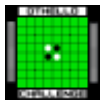
FJ SAIL—SATURDAY, AUGUST 21st, 2010

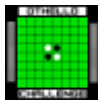
The FJ is a very popular two person boat with a main and a jib. These are used throughout the country for high school and college competitive sailing.

THE LOOK OF THE GAME

Reversi (also marketed by Pressman under the trade name *Othello*) is a board game involving abstract strategy and played by two players on a board with 8 rows and 8 columns and a set of distinct pieces for each side.

In the 1970s the Japanese game company Tsukuda Original registered the game under the trademark name *Othello*. The name was selected as a reference to the Shakespearean play *Othello, the Moor of Venice*, referring to the conflict between the Moor Othello and Iago, who describes himself as "two faced," and more controversially, to the unfolding drama between Othello, who is black, and Desdemona, who is white. The green color of the board is inspired by the image of the general Othello, valiantly leading his battle in a green field.

Dear Yacht Club Members,
It has been a wonderful summer, part of summer enjoyment is boating and that is great. Everyone please take a few minutes and figure out....

- 1) Do we have one or more boats at the KYC?
- 2) Have we paid for them to be there? (check your records to be sure).
Summer livery is \$6.00 per foot.
Empty trailer is \$3.00 per foot.
Winter storage is \$3.00 per foot.
Rack storage is \$3.00 per foot.
Round length up to the nearest foot.
- 3) If you have paid livery and your boat is sitting lake side not being used, or inoperable, it should be removed to the top parking lot at the club.
- 4) If you have not paid livery please pay your livery fee.
- 5) Locks will be installed on boats/trailers with delinquent livery fees.
- 6) If a lock is found on your trailer please contact the commodore of the club.
- 7) Winter livery fees will be applied to boats on KYC grounds on October 15th.

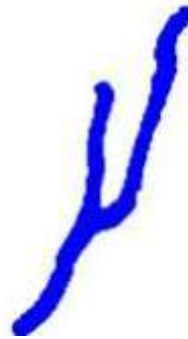

ONE OF A KIND—KEUKA LAKE



Keuka Lake has several distinguishing characteristics that separates it from the other Finger Lakes.

One is the distinct "Y" shape (while the other Finger Lakes have a single "finger" look). Prior to glaciers carving the region's existing river valleys into the deep chasms that now hold the finger lakes, the western and southern branches of Keuka were a single, north-to-south flowing watershed. At that time the current east branch of the lake was a major tributary to the main river. The actions of the glaciers gouged the tributary, creating the Lake's eastern branch and reversed the flow of the drainage, which now effectively flows south-to-north. Although, the western branch of Keuka Lake still flows north-to-south, it joins the northerly flow of the rest of the lake creating a second distinguishing characteristic of the lake. Keuka Lake is the only lake in the country, and one of the few lakes in the world, **to flow both north and south.**

A third, unique, characteristic of Keuka Lake is that it drains into Seneca Lake out of its eastern branch, making it the only Finger Lake to drain into another. The Crooked Lake Canal was built along Keuka's outlet to link the lake with its eastern neighbor, Seneca Lake, and opened in 1833. It was abandoned in 1877, and the [Keuka Outlet Trail](#) now runs along the towpath of the former canal through the outlet gorge. You can hike or bike between Keuka and Seneca Lakes and spot a few waterfalls and historic landmarks along the way.
